James McDonough and his spouse Jennifer bought a 10-acre Russian River Valley property in 2008 and released their first wines in the following vintage. McDonough had been introduced to wines by his father, and he furthered his interest in wine while working for an ad agency in San Francisco, one of whose clients was Robert Mondavi Winery. The 6-acre vineyard was named Wren Hop after the resident birds. It is organically farmed and sits in Goldridge soil. Grapes are also purchased from other Sonoma County and Sta.
