Mike, MD graduated from the Honors Program in Medical Education at Northwestern University in Chicago, Illinois. He continued his education at Northwestern University completing his orthopedic surgery residency in 1985. Following residency, Mike completed a fellowship in pediatric orthopedic surgery at the Scottish Rite Children's Hospital in Atlanta, under the direction of Raymond Morrissy, MD. He did a six-month traveling fellowship in sports medicine. Mike then joined Children's Orthopedics of Atlanta (COA), PC in 1987, and is now its President and CEO.

Dr. Busch is one of the first pediatric orthopedic surgeons in the country with an expertise in sports medicine. He now has a subspecialty certification in sports medicine from the American Board of Orthopedic Surgery. Mike founded the sports medicine program at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta (CHOA), and is now its surgical director.

Mike is actively involved with Children's Healthcare of Atlanta at Scottish Rite where he has served on and chaired numerous committees. He also served as the Vice Director of Surgery and two terms as Director of Surgery at Scottish Rite. Mike also spends some of his time providing program leadership as the Surgical Director, Sports Medicine and the Medical Director, Pediatric Orthopedic Surgery Fellowship Program at Children's. Mike was a member of the committee that developed the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta Pediatric Health Care Alliance, and he served three years on the Board of Directors of this organization that brought together over 500 pediatric primary care physicians and pediatric specialists. He is on the Board of Directors of the Georgia Pediatric Specialists IPA, and the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta Surgery Center at Meridian Mark Plaza, LLC. He is currently the vice-chairman of the Georgia Pediatric Specialists IPA. That's an amazing contribution to medicine Mike! We are very proud to call you ours!!!

Along with her athletic commitments at Marist, she was also involved in student


